# OFFICIAL BUSINESS

The Rudy Autio Workshop at Ghost Ranch

June 12, 1985

Driving into Ghost Ranch for the first time at 10 o'clock at night filled me with a sense of mystery and apprehension. The trail wound into a valley where sheer canyon walls loomed above me like dark silent giants standing guard in the moonlight.

When I arrived at the office there wasn't a soul in sight. Under the glare of the porch light I found a tiny set of instructions taped to the wall telling me to pick up the phone for help. Soon a kindly man arrived and told me to continue on the drive around the meadow and look for room #7 at Staff house. In the darkness I found a building that fit the description and gingerly knocked on the door. From inside I could hear my sleepy roommate climb out of bed and when she opened the door warm friendly light came pouring out and suddenly the dark mysterious night offered warmth, rest, and congenial conversation.

In the bright crisp morning air we took a short stroll down the road and descended the steps to a shed in the glen. Pot Hollow was to be our headquarters for the next 3 1/2 days. The pottery shed supported a large overhang, open on three sides. Standing in the middle, surrounded by work tables and wheels stood Rudy Autio.

As the morning sunlight filtered through the trees about 30 potters assembled in the woodland. We had come together to watch and listen as Rudy wedged clay and began to construct a huge container. His manner was relaxed and confident, that of a man totally comfortable with his work. He spoke about his feeling for simplicity in his tools and equipment. He encouraged the discipline of studying glaze chemistry and developing throwing skills but he deplored the use of gimmicks and crutches in creating art.

The vessel he worked on began to take the shape of a life-size torso, bulging and undulating from within as if occupied by a spirit only Rudy could exorcise. As the form hardened quickly in the dry New Mexican air he incised fanciful cartoon figures of female nudes, horses, and dogs playfully cavorting around the vessel.

While the Wizard worked, the potters inspired by his efforts, slipped away to find their tools and clay. Soon he was surrounded by potters forming clay in every imaginable way, rolling, slapping, throwing, carving, pinching. The quiet glen was transformed by the furor of creativity as though some primal rite was taking place. The sorcerer stood in the middle giving life to his magic vessel and spinning stories to fuel the creative activity all about him.

We worked, exchanged ideas, and felt exhilarated by the presence of a talented spirit. When the daylight departed and put an end to our industry we relaxed over wine and shared stories and showed slides of our work. The days passed much too quickly and soon it was time to return to our homes. We all carried with us a touch of the magic and a bit of the flame that will serve to keep the spirit alive until we return next spring to observe the rites of earth, fire and water.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING?

### Fuller Lodge Art Center ...a Gallery

Fuller Lodge Art Center will open a new exhibit in the Lending Gallery on Friday, July 12. It will be a juried exhibit by artists working in any media, who are members of the art center. Work may be borrowed from the Lending Gallery for a small fee, or may purchase the work from the artists. Eligible artists may send an SASE to FLAC, P.O. Box 790, Los Alamos, NM 87544.

Upcoming Exhibits at Fuller Lodge Art Center:

- June 21- July 28: **Second Biennial Juried Painting, Drawing, and Sculpture Exhibition.** Open to artists living in New Mexico, Texas, Arizona, Utah, and Colorado.
- Aug. 2- Aug. 25: **Sculpture by John Farnham & Quilts by Northern New Mexico Artists.**
- Aug. 30- Sept. 22: **From These Roots.** A large group invitational exhibit of work relating to the artists' cultural or ethnic heritage.

The students of Nader Kahlili (Racing Alone, Earth Fired Houses) will be giving a hands-on experimental workshop to build and fire an adobe building. The workshop will cover: model making and design, clay testing theory and application, adobe block making and construction, burner design and construction, safety procedures and firing of the building.

The site is an old 23 acre feedlot west of Amarillo, Texas being reclaimed by Hunter Ingells and Mary Emeny for the development of an alternative school.

The instructors will include Steven Haines, Henry Dat, Ellwood Pickering, and Alessandra Runyon, and with Marci Asner as photographer. They have extensive adobe construction experience, ceramic and firing background, and all have fired at least one adobe building.

The cost of the two-week workshop is \$575. per person. The fee includes meals

and a camping space, plus all materials and written information. (Sorry, no reductions for facilities or meals not used.) Camper hook-ups are available nearby and motels are located in Amarillo (15 miles away). Registration is limited. A \$200. deposit will reserve a place (not refundable after June 1). Limited scholarships are available. There are no facilities for children, please call to make arrangements. Also, no animals, drugs or firearms please.

We want you to understand that this is still a very experimental building process, and hope you will join us in exploring the possibilities of fired earth construction.

THEME: "Four Days with Rudy Autio"

The New Mexico Potters Association in conjunction with Ghost Ranch announces a four day workshop to be conducted by Rudy Autio. The workshop is designed for maximum exposure to the creativity of Rudy Autio. It will consist of lectures, discussions, demonstrations, and "hands-on" activities. Participants will have the opportunity to express their ideas during the "hands-on" work sessions under the tutelage of the workshop leader.

In addition, each participant is requested to bring a selection of 10-15 slides of their own work to share with the group. These sharing sessions will allow each artist to become better acquainted with their fellow artists.

ABOUT OUR WORKSHOP LEADER:

Rudy Autio was born in Butte Montana in 1926, and has lived in his native state throughout most of his career. He is Professor Emeritus of Art at the University of Montana where he has taught for the 28 years as the head of the ceramics area in the school of Fine Arts.

Autio has conducted numerous workshops in ceramic art throughout the United States and Canada and has exhibited his ceramics in national and international exhibitions. His work is represented in museums and important private collections such as the American Craftsmen Museum, Brooklyn Museum, Portland Art Museum, Toledo Art Museum, the Applied Art Museum in Helsinki, and many other public collections. Following a Tiffany Award in crafts in 1963, he traveled abroad to Italy, returning to New York for a time before resuming his appointment at the University of Montana. In 1981 he was the first recipient of the Governor's Award and named outstanding visual artist in Montana. A National Endowment grant in 1980 enabled him to work in Helsinki, Finland at the Arabia Porcelain Factory as well as conducting workshops and lectures at the University of Helsinki.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Montana, Autio was a founding resident artist and co-director with Peter Voukos of the Archie Bray Ceramics Foundation in Helena Montana. At that time the Foundation became established as an important center for ceramic art. Workshop guest artists such as Shoji Hamada of Japan, Bernard Leach of England, Marguerite Wildenhain, and Carleton Ball visited in the early years. Resident directors as Kenneth Ferguson, David Shaner, Dave Cornell and Kurt Weiser have continued its tradition of excellence.

While Autio's principle work is in ceramics, he has also worked in



sculpture. He has executed many commissions in ceramic relief, tile murals, bronze, and fabricated metal sculpture for public buildings in Montana and the state of Washington.

He is a fellow of the American Crafts Council, Honorary Member of the National Council of Education of Ceramic Artists, the recipient of the American Ceramic Society Art Award in 1978, a trustee of the Archie Bray Foundation, honored as Distinguished Scholar by the University of Montana in 1984, and a member of the International Ceramic Society based in Geneva. A retrospective exhibition of his work at the American Craft Museum completed a two year tour of the United States in 1984.

TOOLS AND SUPPLIES:

Participants are expected to provide their own tools such as modeling tools, paddles, batts etc.

Clay- Each participant should bring at least 75 pounds of stoneware clay. Standard throwing bodies should be altered by additional grog for hand building.

For those people unable to bring their own clay, clay will be available at Ghost Ranch for a nominal cost. Please indicate with your registration whether or not you will require clay. The nearest supplies are over two hours round trip from the Ranch. So do not fail to indicate your clay requirements.

Brushes will be supplied for decorative purposes as well as engobes.

WORKSHOP COSTS:

Workshop registration fee: \$80.00 for NMPA Members  
\$95.00 for non-members (includes \$15.00 membership fee )

Room and Board: Rate per person for workshop period, \$104.00  
(children 12 and under for half of \$52.00)  
Rate includes; dinner and lodging Wednesday May 29; breakfast, lunch, dinner, and lodging Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, May 30, 31, and June 1; breakfast and dinner (noon) Sunday, June 2.

Meals may be taken in the dining hall as desired, providing that some previous notice is given to the office. Rates for individual meals are:

Space in the tent and trailer area is \$6.50 per day. Adequate shower and toilet facilities, coke machine, and a washer and dryer are provided. Some fireplaces and camp tables are provided. Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. We make reservations in terms of total numbers in the area, but not for individual sites. Hook-ups as such are not available. Water and electricity outlets are scattered about, and we do ask in fairness to others that water outlets not be monopolized by continuing connections. A holding tank dump facility is provided. Food supplies and milk are available from our kitchen. Bode's Store at Abiquiu has most of needed grocery items except fresh meat. Firewood is available in the area, but not regularly supplied to each site.

An ice machine is located in the te trailer area. It is not intended to supply a quantity for food preservation, etc. Ice in those quantities is sometimes available for purchase in the kitchen, or block ice from Abiquiu and Espanola. Please cooperate by using it only for ice for occasional daily use and by keeping your children from playing in and with the ice machine.

ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS:

Check in time at the Ranch is the afternoon of May 29. The workshop commences early May 30 and goes through the afternoon of June 2.

Time and place of the NMPA's annual meeting will be announced at the Ranch.

Along with the registration fee please provide the following:  
Board and room requirements; number of meals, lodging; room or tent/trailer area. NMPA is responsible for furnishing this information to Ghost Ranch. Do Not make arrangements with the Ranch on an individual basis. NMPA will handle all reservations.

Room and board will be paid to Ghost Ranch by participants upon check-in.

Be sure to indicate your need for clay. Payment for clay will be due prior to the start of the workshop.

NOTE:

The spaces available for this workshop are limited to 45 people. Registrations have already been received as a result of the Ghost Ranch Bullitin. Allocation will be made on a first-come, first-served basis. Remember the workshop is advertised nationally through the Ghost Ranch Bulletin and Ceramic Monthly. You cannot afford to delay registering. If you do , you may be disappointed. Besides, early registration allows for better planning. The cut-off date for registering is May 20, 1985.
